Mickalene Thomas (Untitled) Sweater

(Untitled) Sweater is a key work from *I was Born to Do Grec Things*, Kavi Gupta's award-winning debut solo exhibition with legendary artist Mickalene Thomas.

Marking a crucial moment in the evolution of her artistic practice following the death of her mother, Thomas mobilized this exhibition as an opportunity to vastly expand her portrait practice into the realm of experiential installation. The title of the exhibition was a quote from Thomas's mother. Casting many of her mother's favorite belongings in bronze-simultaneously destroying the originals in the process-Thomas filled the gallery space with ghostly relics elucidating the complications inherent within love, beauty, and remembrance.

Along with a jacket and a pair of leather pants, *Untitled* (*Sweater*) was part of a small suite of works that Thomas cast for the exhibition from beloved articles of her mother's clothing. Only one *Untitled* (*Sweater*) from the limited series of three was originally made available to collectors.

In the ensuing decade since this landmark exhibition, Thomas has emerged as one of the world's most influential artists. Her innovative practice has yielded one of the most instantly recognizable, and widely celebrated, aesthetic languages within contemporary visual culture, influencing not only other artists, but filmmakers, advertisers, brand ambassadors, fashion designers, and decorators around the world.

Thomas has radically redefined what it means to be a global, multi-disciplinary visual artist. Not only do her masterful mixed-media paintings, sculptures, and installations command every space they occupy, eloquently dissecting the intersecting complexities of Black and female identity within the canon of Western art history, she has also expanded her vanguard studio practice to include curation, filmmaking, and theater.

"By fusing historical influences with pop and personal significance, I aim to blur the distinction of object and subject, concrete and abstract, real and imaginary," Thomas has said.

From the award winning *I* was born to do great things, to Mickalene Thomas: A Moment's Pleasure, the spectacular, three-year long, two-story installation that transformed the east lobby of the Baltimore Museum of Art, to her debut as a Broadway producer for the seven-time Tony Award nominated production of for colored girls who have considered suicide / when the rainbow is enuf, Thomas's work has become an undeniable force within

the contemporary art field, and an indispensable inspiration to younger generations of artists.

Thomas has been awarded multiple prizes and grants, including the USA Francie Bishop Good & David Horvitz Fellow; Anonymous Was A Woman Award; Brooklyn Museum Asher B. Durand Award; and the Timehri Award for Leadership in the Arts. Major exhibitions of Thomas' work include *Mickalene Thomas: Better Nights*, Bass Miami Beach Contemporary Art Museum, FL, *Mickalene Thomas: A Moment's Pleasure*, Baltimore Museum of Art, MD, *Mickalene Thomas: Do I Look Like a Lady?*, MOCA, Los Angeles, CA; *Mickalene Thomas: Femmes Noires*, Art Gallery of Ontario, Ontario, Canada; *Figuring History: Robert Colescott, Kerry James Marshall, Mickalene Thomas*, Seattle Art Museum, Seattle, WA; *Permanent Collection Highlights American Art*, Brooklyn Museum, Brooklyn, NY; *Mickalene Thomas*, Institute of Contemporary Art, Boston, MA and *I Was Born to do Great Things*, Kavi Gupta, Chicago. ARTIST BIOGRAPHY

Mickalene Thomas is one of the most influential artists working today. Her innovative practice has yielded one of the most instantly recognizable, and widely celebrated, aesthetic languages within contemporary visual culture, influencing not only other artists, but filmmakers, advertisers, brand ambassadors, fashion designers, and decorators around the world.

Thomas has radically redefined what it means to be a global, multi-disciplinary visual artist. Not only do her masterful mixed-media paintings, sculptures, and installations command every space they occupy, eloquently dissecting the intersecting complexities of Black and female identity within the canon of Western art history, she has also expanded her vanguard studio practice to include curation, filmmaking, and theater.

Thomas's elaborate rhinestone, acrylic, and enamel paintings are among her most renowned bodies of work. Informed by her long study of art history and the classical genres of portraiture, landscape, and still life, these works expand common definitions of beauty and introduce a complex vision of what it means to be a woman. "By fusing historical influences with pop and personal significance, I aim to blur the distinction of object and subject, concrete and abstract, real and imaginary," says Thomas. "Indeed, the modes through which culture serves to shape perception across social, spatial, and ideological platforms is fundamental to my investigations. Through painting, photography, collage, and installation, my strategies include appropriation and pastiche, whereby the repurposing of formal and conceptual artistic iconology is developed in order to re-evaluate its context. Here, my study of French Impressionism, European modernism and pop art plays a formative influence—wherein pioneers including Bearden, Neel, Picasso, Manet, and Warhol continue to activate my interest and approach."

Thomas considers the subjects that populate her images to be similarly influential, however their significance is often intimate or personal.

"Family, friends, and lovers feature throughout my oeuvre," Thomas says, "subsisting as powerful figures that serve to characterize the subjective, and often otherworldly, propositions that I envision."

Kavi Gupta is proud to announce its first solo exhibition with New York based artist Mickalene Thomas, entitled *I Was Born To Do Great Things*.

"A thing of beauty is a joy for ever: Its loveliness increases; it will never pass into nothingness..." – John Keats

"I Was Born to Do Great Things" are the quoted words of Sandra Bush, Mickalene Thomas's late mother, a statement that speaks for both the dynamic life that she lived as well as her influence and inspiration on Thomas's artistic practice as her longtime muse. Bush has been prominent as a subject in Thomas's works over the past 14 years, inspiring her examinations of identity and style through her magnetic personality and undeniable presence. This presentation of new work explores the personal story of the woman behind the inspiration. This is a story in celebration of womanhood, motherhood, and the power of art as a totem for personal memory, a story in celebration of Sandra.

I Was Born To Do Great Things, Mickalene Thomas's will continue her explorations of her mother and muse, Sandra Bush. Following her film Happy Birthday to a Beautiful Woman (2012), the exhibition acts as a portrait of the artist's mother through her belongings. Taking the form of a domestic installation, Thomas will exhibit a series of bronze works cast from these personal items. Carrying great significance to both her mother and herself, these articles of clothing and jewelry are destroyed through this process of casting and are preserved and transformed into highly finished objects of nostalgia and memory.

In *Mentors, Muses, and Celebrities,* Mickalene Thomas recasts and reconfigures notions of beauty, gender, race, and representation in powerful new and recent works.

Known for her expressive paintings and collages, Thomas builds upon previous explorations into portraiture to create expanded narratives. In these new works she focuses on black women who inspire, who represent, and who express a wide range of possibilities and desires.

Thomas explores and explodes ideas of what it means to be a black woman in the spotlight. Her large-scale, two channel video, *Do I Look Like a Lady?*, presents a chorus of powerful female icons—including Jackie "Moms" Mabley, Wanda Sykes, Whitney Houston, and Eartha Kitt—their images woven together, reflecting an interplay of power through gender and language. Kitt is an especially important figure as Thomas gives the controversial actress and singer a thoughtful re-consideration as a rebellious, sensual, talented, and compelling force. Likewise, the principal female figures in the 1985 film *The Color Purple*—Shug, Sofia, and Celie, the latter portrayed by Whoopi Goldberg—are central to *Mentors, Muses, and Celebrities.* The film deeply affected Thomas when she was a young woman, and in the context of the exhibition the three characters embody qualities of fortitude, power, vulnerability, creativity, and perseverance. Also relating to *The Color Purple*, Thomas created a vinyl print consisting of collaged photos and found film footage, a major new work that will cover the entirety of the 60 foot-long *Project Wall*.

Thomas has designed lounges for the main galleries reminiscent of the 1970s period décor of her childhood. These personal recreations of her domestic environment—where such personal mentors as her mother and aunts gathered together—serve as communal spaces where audiences may interact with the artwork and each other.

Mentors, Muses, and Celebrities has since been exhibited at the Contemporary Art Museum St. Louis from September 8 through December 31, 2017.
